

# The Majesty of God

Thine, O LORD, is the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty:

Bless the LORD, O my soul. O LORD my God, thou art very great; thou art clothed with honour and **majesty**. (Psalm 104:1)

Thine, O LORD, is the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the **majesty**: for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine; thine is the kingdom, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all. (1 Chronicles 29:11)

Let favour be shewed to the wicked, yet will he not learn righteousness: in the land of uprightness will he deal unjustly, and will not behold the **majesty** of the LORD. (Isaiah 26:10)

...that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath shewed it unto them.

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse:

Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

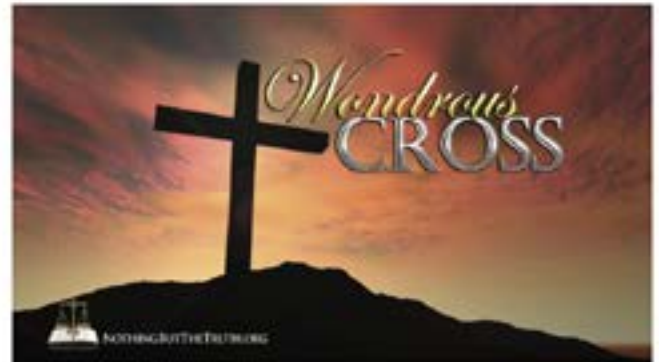
