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And they were instant with loud voices, requir-6. ing that he might be crucified. And the voices of them and of the chief priests prevailed. (Luke 23:23) 7. And the people stood beholding. And the rulers also with them derided him, saving. He saved others: let him save himself, if he be Christ, the chosen of God. (Luke 23:35) And the soldiers led him away into the hall, 8. called Praetorium; and they call together the whole band. And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his head, And began to salute him, Hail, King of the Jews! And they smote him on the head with a reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing their knees worshipped him. And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple from him, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him. (Mark 15:16-20) And the soldiers also mocked him, coming to him, and offering him vinegar, And saying, If thou be the king of the Jews, save (Luke 23:36-37) thyself. 9. Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his mother, 10. and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Cleophas... 11. and Mary Magdalene. (John 19:25) 12. When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own home (John 19:26-27) And there were also two other, malefactors, led 13. with him to be put to death. (Luke 23:32) And one of the malefactors which were hanged railed on him, saying, If thou be Christ, save thyself and us. But the other answering rebuked him, saving, Dost not thou fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?

And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this man hath done nothing amiss. And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in para-(Luke 23:39-43) dise. 14. Now when the centurion saw what was done. he glorified God, saying, Certainly this was a (Luke 23:47) righteous man. 15. And all the people that came together to that sight, beholding the things which were done, smote their breasts, and returned. (Luke 23:48) 16. And all his acquaintance, and the women that followed him from Galilee, stood afar off, beholding these things. (Luke 23:49) 17. And there was one named Barabbas, which lav bound with them that had made insurrection with him, who had committed murder in the (Mark 15:7) insurrection. ...they had then a notable prisoner, called Barabbas. Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them. Whom will ye that I release unto you? Barabbas, or Jesus which is a. called Christ? But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy Jesus. (Matthew 27:16-17, 20) b. Pilate saith unto them. What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ? They all say unto him. Let him be crucified. c. And the governor said, Why, what evil hath he done? But they cried out the more, saving, Let him be crucified. (Matthew 27:16-17, 20-) d. Then released he Barabbas unto them: and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified. (Matthew 27:16-17, 20-26) For when we were yet without strength, in due 18. time Christ died for the ungodly. (Romans 5:6) But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. 19. Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him.

After that, he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once:


After that, he was seen of James; then of all the apostles. (1 Corinthians 15:4-7)
